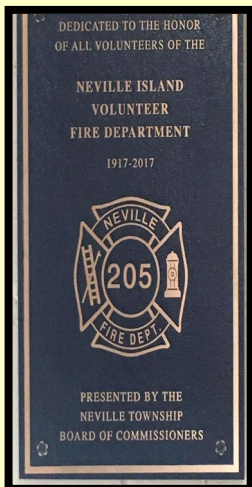

## FALL HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Neville Township Public Works Department will

conduct hydrant and water line flushing on

**THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, AND**

**FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2017,**

**FROM 4:00 PM UNTIL 12:00 AM (MIDNIGHT).**



*Customers may notice discolored water and are asked not to do laundry or use large amounts of water during these hours. If you experience discolored water, please flush your lines by running cold water. If the discoloration remains after 10 – 20 minutes, please call the Township at 412-264-1977.*

## Trick-or-Treat Safety Reminders:

- Stay well-lit; carry flashlights and glow sticks, and use reflective tape on costumes.
- Costumes should be short to avoid tripping; children, and parents, should wear safe, comfortable shoes.
- Avoid masks and use non-toxic make-up instead.
- Use only safe costume props; try to avoid weapons or make sure they are rubber or plastic.
- Inspect all candy before consuming.

**Reminder: The Township's 2017 Street Sweeping Program will end on Wednesday, November 29<sup>th</sup>.**

### KNOW WHAT'S BELOW. CALL 811 BEFORE YOU DIG!

If your fall project plans include any digging or excavation, don't forget to call 811. PA homeowners and contractors are required to contact PA One Call by dialing 811 at least three business days prior to any project that breaks ground. The law applies to even simple projects like planting a shrub or installing a new mailbox post! With one call to 811, utilities will respond to locate underground power, gas, water, and sewer lines and communication cables.
