FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Q. The Garbage Truck did not pick-up my trash, who do I call?

A. Contact Waste Management at 724-266-2604. Make sure your trash was placed on the curb prior to the scheduled pick-up time and does not include items ineligible for disposal.

Q. The garbage truck left my television at the curb? How do I dispose of electronics, such as televisions and computers?

A. It is now illegal to dispose of electronics with any trash headed for a landfill. Residents, landlords, and businesses must recycle electronics. Area companies will pick-up your items or direct you to a drop-off location. FEES MAY APPLY!

Q. A person was in my neighborhood selling door-to-door, is this allowed?

A. All persons conducting door-to-door sales must obtain a soliciting permit from the Ohio Township Police Department. Report questions or concerns to OTPD at 412-259-8304. Non-profit organizations, such as schools and churches are exempt from permit requirements.

Q. Why does the Township sweep the streets?

A. In addition to keeping our neighborhoods looking neat, the Township is required to remove litter, dirt and debris that can wash into the storm sewers. Street sweeping prevents flash floods caused by clogged storm sewers and helps remove pollution before it enters our rivers and streams. By moving for the street sweeper you help keep the Island clean, safe, and avoid a ticket!

The PA Yellow Dot program was created to assist citizens in the “golden hour” of emergency care following a traffic crash when they may not be able to communicate. You can obtain a “Yellow Dot” decal for your rear window that alerts first responders to check your glove box for vital medical information.


